- 2022- **Founder and Chair**, Partners In Democracy
- Founded non-profit to drive Democracy Renovation in Massachusetts and nationally;
 - 4FTE in current start-up mode.
- 2018- **Co-Chair, Educating for American Democracy**, a Consortium established by 5 anchor organizations to create and implement a national roadmap for excellence in History and Civics Learning for All Learners
- Co-led grant process to secure \$2.8 million in grants from National Endowment of the Humanities and U.S. Department of Education in both Trump and Biden administrations;
 - Co-built and led diverse network of 300 educators, academics, and practitioners from around the country, with demographic, geographic, and viewpoint diversity, divided into multiple Task Forces;
 - Co-led Roadmap development process;
 - Co-lead Implementation Consortium, currently with pilots in 9 states.
- 2017- **Co-Chair, Our Common Purpose Commission** from the American Academy of Arts and Sciences
- Co-led a national commission with forty members focused on reinventing American democracy for the 21st century;
